

RE: September Golf Report

Golf Update:

Golf rounds for the month of August continued to be consistent once again with 30,149 rounds played. Lincoln City Golf fiscal year finished up at the end of August. Total golf rounds for the fiscal year ended up at 209,787.

Teams are finishing up fall applications of fertilizer and have a good start on overseeding fairways. The biggest challenge we have been facing is Fall Army Worm. This destructive worm can destroy large areas of turf in a very short time. Our maintenance staffs have done a tremendous job of mitigating the damage by early scouting and mechanical elimination of eggs.



We made it through the Korn Ferry qualifying tournament at Highlands and from what we heard the PGA Tour and players were all happy with the course. Our maintenance team really came together to pull this off without any issues.

Equipment: Our team has done an incredible job keeping our older equipment operational. However, numerous pieces of equipment have outlived a useful life cycle. For example, we have run our pickups to the point of scrapping 3 of the units and selling one other with our contracted equipment auction service. We have purchased a used pickup and will be receiving two

pickups after the first of the new year. Other equipment replacements scheduled are various mowing equipment, equipment trailers and a tractor.

Finish grading of #5 fairway and irrigation installation has been at the forefront in September at Pioneer golf course. The weather has cooperated for the most part and our goal is to have #5 fairway completed by the 1st week of October. Irrigation work on the entire golf course at Pioneers will be in full swing the month of October and November.
